There's also St Williams Nursery – <https://stwilliamsnursery.com/#sthash.gfZ0glbx.dpbs>. They're only native plants but you can buy 1-year herbaceous plugs for \$1 each and woody plugs for \$1.70 each. The minimum order is \$250.

Also Northland Nursery – <https://www.northlandnursery.com/>. Their prices went up from 5.99 to 6.99. 1-gallon pots only. A great source of mother plants.

I'd highly recommend joining <https://www.linkgreen.ca/connect/wholesale-ordering-solution>. It puts buyers and sellers together. They make their money by charging the seller so as a buyer it doesn't cost me a penny. That's how I found St. Williams.

For those in Canada looking for pots, I just bought mine from JVK in Delta, BC (Just noticed that their head office is in St. Catharines, ON as well). Got 3 cases of Poppelmann's Teku VCC15US pot (6" tall x 5" high) and came to \$0.22/pot delivered (including shipping).

Buying Pre-emergent herbicides in Canada

In Ontario, you need to get licensed for chemicals (pesticides / pre-emergents). If you go to any farm co-op they will tell you about a local course in your area and what types of products they can sell to you with the license. It's a 1-day course with an exam. below is a link
